

Class of 2024 Graduation Requirements

Master of Science in Community Medicine (MSCM)

Students in the MSCM program are required to complete 48.0 credits over two years of study. Of the 48.0 total credits, students must complete 24.0 credits of Core courses, 6.0 credits of Track-specific courses, and 18.0 credits of Community Engagement Capstone courses. Didactic courses in this program are offered online asynchronously using active learning methods.

Students must dedicate at least 10 hours per week to the Community Engagement Capstone Project in Year 2.
